WILLIAM de JEANNE: son of Henry de Jeanne. WILLIAM de JEANNE was born in Bristol, England on January 25, 1618. He died in Setauket, Long Island, N.Y. March 24, 1714. His father Henry de Jeanne was a graduate of Oxford University and a lecturer on Theology and Divinity. He is said to be the descendant of Guido de Jeanne, a famous general in the service of the French Confederation. This son, WILLIAM de JEANNE owing to religious persecution fled to America, landing at New Haven, Conn. about 1670. He was married at New Haven, Conn. to Annie Biggs on June 10th, 1675. She was then 22 years of age. They then moved to Brookhaven, L.I. on June 11, 1676; Annie Biggs was his second wife, he being a widower with grown sons in England.

TIMOTHY JAYNE (Captain) In Kachleiu's Battalion of Col.

Following is a record of the family of WILLIAM JAYNE, 3rd and Tabitha Norton compiled by B.G. Jayne in 1909 and submitted by Rev. Garford F. Williams from records he received from Mrs. Mary E.A. Adams, Berwick, Penna. This recently received material is more detailed than the records above, hence I am incorporating them into the Jayne Family History.

WILLIAM JAYNE, 3rd, eldest son of WILLIAM JAYNE, 2nd and Elizabeth Woodhull, born at Setauket, L.I. He was born April 12, 1712. Married Tabitha Norton Dec. 3, 1773. Died Jan. 2, 1798. Tabitha Norton was the daughter of Isaac Norton and Tabitha Jones. She was born Oct. 13, 1713 and died July 21, 1808.

Children of WILLIAM JAYNE, 3rd and Tabitha Norton

WILLIAM JAYNE, 4th born Jan. 3, 1735. Died Nov. 16, 1776 Killed at the battle of Fort Washington. Married Elizabeth Chambers Jan. 3, 1755

ANNA JAYNE born Feb. 13, 1737, died June 10, 1821. Married Benajah Gustin Jan. 2, 1765. Buried at Middle Smithfield, Penna.

ELIZABETH JAYNE born Feb. 2, 1739. Died Aug. 8, 1820. Married Nathaniel Owen June 24, 1757. Buried at Brookhaven, L.I.

TIMOTHY JAYNE born April 15, 1741. Died Mar. 20, 1790 at Ithaca while on an exploring expedition. He was buried at Coolbaugh, Monroe Co., Penna. He married Sarah Allen May 6, 1763

REBECCA JAYNE born Dec. 10, 1743. Married Richard Horton May 10, 1761. Died July 13, 1831 and was buried in Bradford Co., Penna.

ISAAC JAYNE born Nov. 26, 1746. Married Anna Lauterman July 13, 1769. Died Jan. 12, 1809 and was buried at Middle Smithfield, Penna.

JOHN JAYNE born Jan. 6, 1749. Married Cornelia Decker Sept. 13, 1775. Died April 25, 1838 and buried in Scott, Wayne Co., Penna.

DAVID JAYNE born May 14, 1751. Died Mar. 9, 1837 and buried at Barrington, Steuben Co., N.Y. He married Elizabeth DeWitt April 21, 1773. She was born May 3, 1754. She died Feb. 15, 1826. She was the daughter of Daniel DeWitt and Mary Dalton DeWitt.

EBENEZER JAYNE born Feb. 19, 1754. Married first to Elizabeth Riggs Mar. 25, 1781 and second to Mary DeWitt July 7, 1783. Mary DeWitt was the daughter of Isaac DeWitt and mother of David Jayne M.D. LL.D. of Philadelphia and grandmother of Horace Jayne, dean of the University of Pennsylvania. EBENEZER JAYNE died May 27, 1826 and was buried at Canton, Salem Co. N.Y.

Hart's Flying Camp Pennsylvania Militia. Captain of First Battalion of Associators in the County of Northampton, Province of Penna., during the Revolution 1776 to 1783. He was captured together with his brothers, Isaac and Ebenezer who were Lieutenants and Ensign respectively of his Company and made prisoners with his Company in the Battle of Long Island, N.Y. Aug. 27, 1776 and was exchanged Dec. 9, 1776. TIMOTHY JAYNE, Captain, -born 1741. Married Sarah Allen Jan. 3, 1744. The History of Broome Co. N.Y. 1885, p. 506-8 says that the Allens are of early English immigration in Colonial history and settled in Conn. Nehemiah Allen, great grandfather of Dr. Solomon P. Allen of Whitney's Point became a resident of Penna. during the troublesome times with the Indians and was one of the number who fled from the beautiful valley at the time of the Wyoming Co. Massacre to Bradford Co. Penna.

His son David Allen, son of Nehemiah Allen and grandfather of Dr. Solomon P. Allen raised a family of nine children in West Franklin Co., Penna. Of this family Solomon was next to the youngest. He married Betsy A Fairchild. He died a few months after the marriage. Dr. Solomon P. Allen was born after the death of his father. There are a great many by the name of Allen in and around Binghamton, N.Y. (1950)

SARAH ALLEN wife of Captain TIMOTHY JAYNE was the daughter of David Allen. Allen Township was named for this Allen family. Indians plundered the house of James Allen on Oct. 8, 1763 at the time of the Wyoming Co. Massacre in Allen Township. There was no reports of any deaths there. Whitehall Township was the scene of a brutal Indian massacre. History of Northampton Co. Penna. 1st Vol.

CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE died on Mar. 20, 1790 while on an exploring expedition in the lake country of Central N.Y., at a little settlement at the head of Cayuga Lake, where Ithaca now stands. "Captain TIMOTHY JAYNE was a large man, red haired and utterly fearless." Penna. Archives show that: CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE of Northampton Co. Penna. who formerly lived at Setauket, Long Island, born there in 1741, was sent on a recruiting trip in 1776 to Orange and Suffolk Counties, N.Y. to get enlistments for 10,000 men to be known as Hart's Flying Company which was authorized by Continental Congress early in 1776, organized at Brunswick, Penna July 27, 1776 composed of separate battalions to be ready for any emergency. It is said that he recruited a number of men who were of Jayne families in what is known as Kaltius Battalion. The following Jayne names

are found: CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE'S brothers John Jayne, 2nd. Reg Orange Co., Lieutenant Isaac Jayne, Ensign Ebenezer Jayne and David Jayne. The fifth brother, William Jayne 4th, did not serve from Northampton. He and his son, William Jayne 5th, were killed at the Battle of Ft. Washington, N.Y. Other Jayne names were: Abednego and Meshach Jayne, sons of James Jayne of South Haven, L.I.; Benjamin, Jonathan, Stephen Jayne, sons of Isaac Jayne of Goshen N.Y.; Samuel Jayne, son of Robert Jayne, Setauket, L.I.; William Jayne, son of James Jayne, Smithtown, L.I.

CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE, 7th Company. May 21, 1777; John Wetzel Lt. p.426. Return officers of the 6th Battalion of Militia in the Co. of Northampton, Penna. Payroll of CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE'S Co. of the 7th class of Northampton Co., Penna Militia, 23 of April 1778 p. 553. Penna Archives 5th Series and Sec. Series.

It is said that there were fifty nine men by the name of Jayne who served in the Revolution of which number only eighteen men survived.

Only a few privates escaped death. The officers were exchanged for British officers. CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE was exchanged for Captain Swan, of the British army. The brothers of CAPTAIN TIMOTHY JAYNE were all officers except John Jayne. The Daughters of the American Revolution Lineage Books.

LETTERS FROM B.G (Benajah) JAYNE WHO WAS COMPILING THE HISTORY OF THE JAYNE FAMILY OF LONG ISLAND FROM THE EMIGRANT WILLIAM de JEANNE 1668 and Annie Biggs

The following are copies of letters written to Mrs. John Dull (who was Mary Evaline Jayne, better known as M.Eva Jayne, the eldest daughter of Porter Jayne, of Wyoming Co. Penna), while she lived near Deland, Iowa, Winnebago Co. in 1903.

I have been getting the data for a family record and a history of the Jayne family from the origin of the name "Jayne".

William de Jeanne was a Chaplain in Cromwell's Army, when in 1660, Chas. the 2nd was restored to the throne. William sought safety in flight and to hide his identity, he assumed the name of Jayne. Coming to America he landed at New Haven, Conn. and there married Anna Biggs (Beggs) in 1673. With ten others, he crossed the Sound to Long Island and settled at the head of Setauket Bay, 52 miles east of New York City. He there raised a family of eight children. The family were still all on Long Island and in Orange County, N.Y. and Northampton Co. Penna when the American War of Independence came. His descendants of the third and fourth generation were then on the active stage.

Captain Timothy Jayne and my grandfather John Jayne were brothers. Timothy born in 1741 and John in 1749. They were both born on the old Homestead on Long Island but went with their father, William Jayne 3rd to Northampton Co., Penna.. There the sons of Captain Timothy Jayne, David, William and John, who settled in what is now Wyoming Co., Penna, were born and there my father was born. He was the son of John Jayne, the brother of Captain Timothy Jayne.

Your great grandfather, David Jayne, lived in Tunkhannock Township in 1848. He was then eighty years of age (approximate birth date 1768). I obtained your grandfather, Timothy Jayne's family record and that of his brothers some twenty years ago. I am now trying to bring the records down to date and hope to have it completed this year, when it will be put in print. Much of the preliminary work is now being done such as making the plates for reproducing some old rare documents, some of them of the 17th century. I want your father's family record and that of each of his children who have families.

I am indebted to Prof. David A. Jayne, your Uncle David Jayne's youngest son, for your address. I wrote to your brother Prof. J.M. (John Marklin) Jayne but have no response, probably misdirected. I enclose a blank for your father's record to be filled out.

Please let me hear from you soon. Your cousin, Prof. David A. Jayne, is finishing the records of your father's brothers and sisters.

I come to the state of Iowa nearly every year to attend a family reunion of my father's family. I have two brothers and two sisters in Johnson Co., Iowa, and two brothers in Nebraska. Our average age is over 75 years, my eldest brother being nearly 84. With kindly regards to all of the blood and name.

Dear Cousin:

Yours containing your father's and your family record came this morning.

Now in answer to your letter. All "Jaynes" are cousins. Your great grandfather, David Jayne, was a first cousin to my father. I went with my father to visit him in 1848. He lived then in Tunkhannock Township. David Jayne was then 80 years old. My father was born on the adjoining place to David, in Middle Smithfield, Monroe Co., Penna. Their fathers Captain Timothy Jayne and John Jayne were brothers. They were both born on the Old Jayne Homestead on Long Island, where their great grandfather, settled in 1670. By the way the inscription upon the tombstone of the first man by the name of Jayne is perfectly legible to this day. It reads "Here lyes ye body of William Jayne, born at Bristol, England, Jan. 25th, 1618. Deed. Mch ye 24th, 1714. Aged 96 yrs." He was the chaplain of Oliver Cromwell and fled to America for safety. I have never found a Jayne that I could not trace to him.

My brother John W. and Justus F. live at Lone Tree, Iowa, on the Muscatun and Western R.R. and my sisters Kate Jayne Underwood and Emily Jayne Robinson live in the same place. John W. is in his 84th years Justus is 74. I am 72 and the youngest of five brothers living.

There are lots of Jaynes in Iowa. John and David Jayne live in Iowa City, Iowa. Their grandfather, Elder Ebenezer Jayne, was a brother to Captain Timothy and my grandfather, John Jayne. Ebenezer was the Ensign of Captain Timothy Jayne in the Revolution. William E. Jayne at Independence, Iowa is a grandson of Elder David Jayne another brother of Captain Timothy and John Jayne of the Revolution. Jacob L. Jayne of Brownsboro, Iowa is a grandson of Lieut. Isaac Jayne, another brother of Captain Timothy Jayne. Our name Jayne has no Dutch in it. It is Puritan pure and simple. I hope to be able to come to Iowa this fall. If I do, there will be a gathering of the clan as there always is, if I come. Lone Tree is 16 miles S.E. of Iowa City. If I come I will let you know and you come down. All Jayne latch strings are on the outside.

Dear Cousin:

Don't get scared at the second letter so soon. I failed to tell you the original name of William Jayne. It was de Jeanne which translated is "Of John". The name "de Jeanne" first appeared in England when Guido de Jeanne, a General in the Service of the French Confederation, accompanied Henry, the Second (who was a son of the Empress of Germany) to England, and placed him upon the throne. Guido was then knighted by Henry II, and given the Manor of Kirkling in Cambridgeshire. Our ancestor was the son of Henry de Jeanne, a lecturer on Theology and Divinity. I have a certificate from the College of Heraldry of England with a copy of the coat of arms. But I prefer to stop with the old Puritan who dared to think for himself and fight for his opinions, and the good sense to flee when his neck was in danger and the cards stacked against him so that he had no chance.

Dear Cousin: Your valued letter containing your family record came this morning for which accept thanks. I now have the record of your father's descendants complete excepting your brother Alexander.

I wrote for his at the same time I wrote you. Hope to hear from him soon.

Yes, there are a good many Jaynes in Washington, Oregon and California. How near to Edwall is Davenport? I see your daughter married the youngest son of Charles S. Jayne, your second cousin. I am much indebted to him for the record of his grandfather, his father, his uncles and his brothers and sisters, furnished years ago. I have a number of grand nephews and nieces, grandchildren of my brother John W. Jayne, Yakima, Wash. The Rev. Julius E. Jayne who has been on a visit there, called on me on Saturday. He is a grandson of a brother of mine and is in his 40th year. I told him he made me realize that I was getting old. Prof. J. M. Jayne, a son of Charles Jayne's cousin, Porter Jayne, is at Yakima. Your Uncle Daniel has two sons just over the Washington line in Oregon. Robert A. Jayne is at Springfield, Lane Co. He is a doctor. Andrew A. Jayne a lawyer is at Hood River near the Dalles. They are a couple of bright fellows, sons of his last wife raised out in Iowa. Andrew has been the public prosecutor for his district for three terms. Yes, the Pacific Coast and even the Islands beyond seem to be the promised land for the descendants of William Jayne. There are Jaynes in every state in the Union and every territory and most of the Provinces of Canada. They are a stalwart race and as Charles S. Jayne wrote years ago, they manage to live long and keep out of jail. If you see Charles who has added an S. to his name tell him I am waiting anxiously to hear from him.

Be sure that your brother sends in his records with a cordial greeting to all who bear the name, I am

Letters from B. G. Jayne to Mrs. Lydia Jayne Burgess written June 19, 1919 when he was in his 89th year.

Elder David Jayne was the most famous man of his Baptist denomination of his day. He died in Tioga Co., N. Y. in 1836, in the 85th year of his age.

The Hymn Book that you mention was composed by Elder Ebenezer Jayne. He was a brother of Elder David Jayne and Captain Timothy Jayne.

Timothy Jayne and Sarah Allen has a daughter Anna Jayne born April

22, 1764 who married March 13, 1781 to David Ogden. He died after 1790 and before 1800. Anna went to Ithaca, N.Y. and married Aaron Van Houten.

Anna Jayne and David Ogden had a daughter Elizabeth Ogden born Feb. 27, 1782 who married 1799 Deacon Isaac Beach of Enfield ? perhaps Penna.

Another letter from B.G. Jayne to Mrs. Lydia Jayne Burgess

I am also in possession of the autograph parole ticket of Samuel Jayne signed by General or Governor ? Tryon when he was released from the Prison Ship in New York Harbor, New York City. Samuel Jayne was a member of Captain Timothy Jayne's Company at the Battle of Long Island.

Timothy Jayne Jr. son of Captain Timothy Jayne lived at Saltsburg or Saltsbury perhaps N.Y. or Penna. on the old National Turnpike west of the Blue River.

I found history of three children all dead now. He had three sons and four daughters married. Ten grandchildren.

A son, Alexander Jayne had as a descendant Nancy Hull Baird of Indianapolis, Ind. (perhaps a grand daughter ? L.J. Dull)

Charles E. Jayne in business in New York City.

Frank Jayne who is President of Western Union Telegraph and the Superintendent (Vice) of the Pacific Division, San Francisco, Calif.

Alexander Jayne son of Timothy Jayne Jr. was a Mayor of Pittsburg, Penna.

Timothy Jayne a son of William Jayne living in Oklahoma has several children.

Timothy Jayne has two sisters living, Lavina Jayne Corson living at Summersville, Penna.

Sisters of Timothy Jayne son of William Jayne:

Julia Ann Jayne Corson Res. Parker City, Penna. Julia Ann Jayne, dau. of Timothy Jayne Jr. married Samuel Duncan. They have a son in Oklahoma and a dau in Bloomfield, Ill. The son is Henry. The dau. married Henry Simons? and they have two children.

Rebecca Jayne, dau of Captain Timonty Jayne married Rev. Wm Hough. They have a son <sup>at</sup>port Jervis. A son Timothy J. Hough who was 35 years old is a prominent man in Syracuse, N.Y. Numerous descendants in N.Y. and New Jersey. The last of the family died in 1861. I have a photograph taken at 80 years of age.

Daniel Jayne, son of Captain Timothy Jayne was a Major in the War of 1812. He married and went to Indiana, in Ohio County, in the S.E. corner of the state.

Daniel B. Jayne, his youngest son, was a Captain in the War of the Rebellion. He is still living in Vevay, Switzerland Co., Ind.

John B. Jayne, his older brother, went into the army with three sons. John is dead. Sons are living and keeping the name alive with little less than a battalion of young Jaynes.

Sarah Jayne, dau of Captain Timothy Jayne used to live two miles from Stroudsburg, Penna. I visited her in 1854. She was then past 70 years of age. Her son-in-law, Otis Gorden, was the sheriff of the county and he and his wife Mary A. Decker Gorden, accompanied me. I thought her the most beautiful old lady I had ever seen.

Eliza Jayne, the youngest of Captain Timothy Jayne, is living in Pony Hollow Road between Ithaca and Elmira, N.Y. Her next door neighbor is Cousin David Jayne, son of Elder David Jayne. I visited her often and knew her five daughters, Sarah, Jane, Hammett, Ann and Lydia. Ann married David D. Jayne, son of Duff Green Jayne and still lives on the Old Homestead.

I remember Sarah White who married Stephen W. Brown in lives in Newfield. She came to see me in Ithaca in 1859 after visiting cousins in Wyoming Co.

Rev. S. R. Jayne of Pamisville was a grandson of Isaac Jayne. Isaac Jayne, William Jayne and my father, Beniah Jayne, were sons of three brothers. His grandfather is the only one of Isaac Jayne's children of whom I have no trace.

The Jaynes of Manchester, Michigan are the descendants of Meciah Jayne who left Long Island about 1793 and moved to Canada.

I hereby certify that I have for many years been compiling a History and Family Record of the Jayne Family and have in my possession records of the antecedents and also of Captain Timothy Jayne.

Timothy, Ebenezer and Daniel Jayne died near Pittsburg, Penna. Dec. 1850. A son, Julius Jayne, was in the employ of Dr. David Jayne's Philadelphia management agency.

Ebenezer Jayne served in the War of 1812. Wounded in the neck. He lived near Cincinnati, Ohio.

David Jayne, William Jayne, John Jayne, sons of Captain Timothy Jayne settled in Wyoming Co., Penna.

Abraham or Abram Jayne, a son of lieutenant Isaac Jayne, settled in Wyoming Co., Penna.

Peter Jayne, son of Lieut. Isaac Jayne, settled in Wyoming Co., Penna. or Bradford Co., Penna.

Samuel Jayne, son of Elder David Jayne, settled in Wyoming Co., Penna.

Charles E. or S. Jayne of N.Y. is a grandson of a brother of Captain Timothy Jayne, who settled at Sallsburg, Penna. when William, David and John settled in Wyoming Co., Penna.

Alexander Jayne, a son of Capt. Timothy Jayne's son Timothy Jayne Jr. was Mayor of Pittsburg in 1850 to 1854 and died while serving.

It is difficult to understand the different generations of Timothys.

Timothy Jayne Jr., son of Capt. Timothy Jayne, was born Sept. 4, 1777. He married Isabella Trimbel. He had three sons and four daughters. He married in 1807. Died in 1851. Isabella Trimbel was born in 1785. She died in 1845.

Dear Cousin:

Your letter of yesterday came and to answer your questions I will say that the name DE JEANNE first appears in England when Guido de Jeanne, a general in the service of the French Confederation, was detailed to escort Henry II and place him on the throne of England,

Henry being the son of the Empress of Germany and grandson of Henry I.

Henry knighted Guido and made him commander of the English army and gave him the Manor of Kirkling in Cambridgeshire. Among the descendants of Guido de Jeanne, was one Henry de Jeanne, who was a graduate of Oxford, England in 1611 and became a lecturer on Theology and Divinity in Oxford University. Henry de Jeanne had a son, William de Jeanne, who was born at Bristol, England, January 25, 1618. William de Jeanne became a student at Oxford University, but was expelled under the "Decree of Uniformity" that provided that persons not holding to all of the articles of the Westminster Creed, could not be educated in the school, academy, colleges, or universities of the realm. William being expelled as a dissenter, joined Cromwell and became his chaplain.

When Charles II was restored to the throne, William de Jeanne fled and changed his name to escape ecclesiastic persecution, hiding for a time in the wilderness of Monmouthshire where his wife died. He then took ship and came to New Haven, Conn. where his uncle William de Jeanne had come with Elder Davenport's Colony in 1634. The uncle was the first town clerk of New Haven and finally changed his name to JAMES. So you will see, the two families have a common origin.

William de Jeanne arrived in New Haven in 1670 and in June 1675 when he was past fifty-seven years of age, married Anna (Annie), daughter of John Beggs (Biggs) and the same year, in company with ten others, crossed Long Island Sound and purchased what is now the town of Brookhaven. (In New York we have towns as a sub-division of a county. In Pennsylvania it is a township.) Brookhaven runs from the Sound to the ocean and is twenty two miles lengthwise of the Island. Under a regulation of the crown, the Indian title had to be extinguished before a grant from the crown would be made. Having made their purchase of the Indians they made application for a grant from the crown. The names in the deed from Setauket of the Nassau Indians and his associates run in the same order as the names in the Crown grant---Nathaniel Brewster, Nathaniel Woodhall, William Jayne and Ebenezer Hulse etc. This grant was completed in 1678 and allotments made to the grantees according to the New England System, the fee of the remainder of the land after allotments vesting in the town.

Upon the organization of the town in 1678, William Jayne was made one of the trustees of the town and remained a trustee until 1779, when his son William Jayne Jr. succeeded him as trustee and his second son, John Jayne, was elected constable and collector. I do not know where photographs can be obtained, but copies of them were duly recorded in the town records of Brookhaven and all the records of the town are still extant. I have spent many hours in deciphering the old records now dim with age. I have the record of the Jayne family more complete than any printed records that I have ever examined. I am now seventy-eight years of age and of the same generation as your grandfather. My grandfather was the last of his family and

was next older than his brother, Rev. David Jayne. I used to sit on my grandfather's knee and listen to the story of the family and the story of the Revolution and for sixty years I have, as opportunity occurred, gathered the data and records of the family. No person who has not undertaken it can know the patient work required to gather the records of an old colonial family.

On'y yesterday, I received a letter from a lady on Long Island who had come across a letter I had written her grandmother more than twenty years ago. She asked me to give her the parentage of her great grandfather. There is probably not another person living who has seen and conversed with your grandfather, your great grandfather, Samuel Jayne, and your great great grandfather, Rev. David Jayne.

When I was a boy in my sixth year, Elder David Jayne came from Barrington, Stauben Co., N.Y. to Wayne Co., Penna. to see my grandfather John Jayne, and I remember seeing them embrace and kiss each other when they met and when they parted. The one was eighty-six and the other was eighty-eight.

In 1848, I went with my father to what is now Wyoming Co. Penna. to visit his cousins who had settled in Wyoming Co., David, William and John Jayne, the three eldest sons of Captain Timothy Jayne. My grandfather's second brother, David Jayne lived at Eaton's Neck some miles below Tunkhannock, Penna. William Jayne lived at Mehoopany, Penna. and John Jayne lived near Russell Hill, Penna. and their cousin, Abram Jayne, the eldest son of my grandfather's third brother, Lieu. Isaac Jayne, who lived on Russell Hill and Samuel Jayne, the eldest son of Rev. David Jayne. (It is the descendants of these five cousins of my father's that meet annually at Mehoopany) We called at your grandfather's. I remember your mother there about five years of age. I obtained there the names and dates of birth of all these families. Our great grandmother, Elsie Stephens, had a twin sister, Ester Stephens who married Stephen W. Fullerton, a cousin of my mother, and she told me she had not heard of her sister in thirty years. I remember her astonishment when I told her that her sister was the last one to kiss me goodbye when I left home. Now, my cousin, forgive an old man for inflicting this long story on you, but you may find some items of interest in it.

I have intended to print the history of the Jayne family and the Jayne Family record but have not found the time to put this data all in shape. It would make a volume of a thousand pages, 11x14 inches, to put in proper shape and includes the old documents. I have old deeds from 1710 and old wills and say 220 reproductions of portraits of the more prominent members of the family. As you will see, the family was preeminently a colonial Puritan family and took an active part in the Revolution.

But enough, I will send you this family record of the third William Jayne when I get time to copy it. Did I send you the family record of Elder David Jayne. No, you need not return what I send you.

The tombstone of the first Jayne in this country in the old Puritan burying ground at Setauket, Suffolk, Long Island, bears the following inscription:

age 96 years

William Jayne Senior had seven sons in nine children. One son was James Jayne of whom there are many descendants in Rhode Island, Conn. and New Jersey and they spell the name JANES. Bishop Edmund Storer Janes D.D. LL.D., a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, born in Sheffield, Berkshire Co., Mass. April 27, 1807; and his twin brother, Edwin L. Janes, a Methodist minister, were of this family. Both of these men were considered the most eminent Methodist ministers of their day.

William Jayne Junior, son of Annie Beggs (Biggs) and William Jayne Senior, was born at Setauket, Brookhaven, Suffolk Co. Long Island in 1678 and died there in 1756. He married Elizabeth Woodhull born in 1688 and died in 1742.

Dear Mrs. Adams,

I have copied two more sheets from the thousands in my Jayne Family Record that I have been sixty years in compiling and I am sure that it contains much that you could get from no other source. For instance, the names, dates of birth, names of husbands and wives, with the dates of marriage, are copied from autographed letters by Elder David Jayne to his grandson, Silas Carter Jayne of Barrington, Cook Co., Illinois, (The only son of his son Benajah Jayne.) and given to me by Silas Carter Jayne in 1855. The names, dates of birth of the record of William Jayne 3rd was copied by me from his old Bible, then in possession of his grandson, Peter Jayne, son of Isaac Jayne, who lived on the Old Homestead over sixty years ago. The house was burned and the old Bible with it nearly fifty years ago, and I do not believe anyone else even made and preserved a copy.

No one who has not compiled a family record covering two centuries can know the infinite amount of detail and work required. About 1792 Elder David Jayne moved to the town of Barrington, Cook Co. Illinois, then Tioga Co., now Steuben Co., N.Y. and that was his home until he died. For many years he was what we call an evangelist. He started and built up many churches. I give you on the back of the record and extract from Dr. Worden's history of the Baptist Church.

I think this record will answer most of the questions suggested by the blank spaces.

William Jayne Senior, the emigrant, raised seven sons and two daughters, one of whom was James Jayne of whom there are many descendants in Rhode Island, Conn., and New Jersey, and they spell the name JAMES. Bishop Edmund Storer James D.D. LL.D., a Bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, born in Sheffield, Berkshire Co. Mass., April 27, 1807; and his twin brother, Edwin L. James, a distinguished Methodist minister, were of this family. Both of these men were considered the most eminent Methodist ministers of their day.

Elder David Jayne was one of six brothers, five of whom held commissions in the Continental Army of the Revolution. Timothy Jayne was a captain; and he and his whole company were taken prisoners at the Battle of Flat Bush on Long Island and held over two years on a prison ship in New York Harbor. Two brothers were with him, Isaac and Ebenezer, one a lieutenant and the other an ensign. One brother, William, was killed at the Battle of Fort Washington, Nov. 16, 1775.

Timothy Jayne, Captain, is buried at Coolbaugh, Monroe Co., Penna. Physically, Timothy Jayne was a large powerful man, not the largest of the brothers, but far above average size, and like a good many of the family, had red hair. In fact the Jaynes as a family, might be called a red-haired race. Timothy was regarded as the leader of the brothers in any enterprise. At one time his brothers except one served in a company which was under his command in the Revolution.

Captain Timothy Jayne's service covered the years 1776 to 1783. He was Captain in Kachlein's Battalion, Penna. Militia and taken prisoner at the Battle of Long Island, Aug. 27, 1776 and was exchanged Dec. 9, 1776. His relatives who served as privates were not so fortunate but were held prisoners on the prison ship, "Jersey".

In 1901-1904 I understand a photograph was made of William Jayne's, the emigrant, grave stone and also his house in "Snarling Hollow" on Snarl Howlow Road" Setauket (now known as the "Old Coach Road", as per Mr. Howard Sherwood, the present owner. He purchased the house in 1908. Up to then I understand it had been in the Jayne family. I understand he is still alive and spends his week-ends and summers there. The photo of the house was made in 1899 and still had the out buildings in tact. In 1937 I visited Setauket several times. I went through the house a couple of times and took photographs, would be pleased to send you prints if you care to have them. They show the house practically as it now is--if the hurricanes have not blown down the wonderful walnut trees!

EXCERPT from an article, The Land of the Sea-Tel-Cots (Setauket) compiled by Charles A. Jayne about 1937. Sent to Miss Lillian Jayne Dull about 1944

In 1664, the Dutch Colony of New Amsterdam was taken over by the English and with it went Long Island. It was at this time that an Englishman by the name of William Jayne, then in his forty-sixth year came from Bristol, England to Setauket. His trade was cooperage. He elected to settle in a natural hollow in the hills two or three miles back from the water and a mile or so from the Village Green. Here he built a substantial house, facing South, with a hill rolling up at its back to cut off the cold North winds. On his left were his fields, to his right were his orchards. The walls of the house were shingled, nailed on with hand hewn nails and was what is known as a double house, that is, an entrance hall in the middle with rooms on either side. At the rear and ample lean-to was built which housed the cooking domain. A large chimney ran up the center of the house so that each room on the ground floor had its fire place. On the second floor were three bedrooms and storage space.

Of course the ceilings of the ground floor were supported by thick hand hewn beams but in the North rooms of the first and second floor

a very unusual wall treatment was applied. It consisted in painting the plaster with a diaper pattern in some long-lived vines and leaves and flowers which are in a very fair state of preservation today. It is thought that they were done by an artist from Conn. where similar paintings are extant.

Before and behind the house, black walnuts trees were planted. Both the trees resulting from this planting are still standing. The one at the front of the house is some seven feet in diameter and has been used as an example of American trees in the Child's Book of Knowledge. The present owner is a gentleman of refinement and evident means. He purchased the house in 1908 with the property. Until that time the house and grounds had been owned and lived in by descendants of the original William---two hundred and forty three year in the same family, an unusual record for an American family.

Following is a continuation of Charles A. Jayne's letter to Miss Dull of Nov. 23, 1944

I also have a photo of the grave stone of Captain Timothy Jayne. He was buried in Middle Smithfield Cemetery, Penna. in 1790 at 49 years of age. Others are buried there. I have a letter describing.

David Jayne Hill: I believe you can forget it, as I recall it was simply a case of his father admiring old Dr. David Jayne.

I have a number of letters to my father, Harry Walker Jayne, from various Jaynes in the different states; 1907, Allentown, Penna., who went up to the reunion at Mehoopany, Penna. (This was Nelson R. Jayne) 1907, Ella Lowery Jayne, Greenville, Miss. written from Atlantic City, saying her grandfather was Joseph M. Jayne. 1904 Miss Minna McLeod Beck, Atlanta, Ga. Her grandmother was a Miss Jane. Her uncle spoke of a Northern branch who spelled the name with a "y". There was a history of the family printed just before the Civil War. Her uncle had a copy but it was misplaced. Had extracts from it and a straight line back to the first William.

Speaking of letters, I keep in touch with Judge Ira Jayne of Detroit at long intervals. He was a \$1 a year man in World War I and was sent to Philadelphia. We matched trees and came together in the sixth generation. He was much interested at the time as he stated they had a yearly Jayne reunion in their vicinity and as many as 150 attended. As I recall at that time he wrote to a lot of Jaynes but what came of it I do not know. In his last letter, Jan. 5, 1944, I met Thos. Ramont of N.Y. whose mother was a Jayne and whose father wrote a history of the Jayne family in N.Y. City. Interesting! Also he corresponds with Judge Wilfred Jayne of N.J.. Have not met him but he has (according to Ira Jayne) traced his line.

EXCERPT from an article compiled by Charles Adams Jayne and sent to Miss Lillian Jayne Dull in 1944. Art. titled "Land of the Sea-Tel-Cott"

In approximately 1639 a party of settlers in New England decided to move over and settle on Long Island. In advance, four men went over to the island and arranged for the purchase of a large plot of ground located at the Eastern end of the Island. The ground selected ran from Sound to the Ocean and was about fifty miles in length. These men dealt directly with the Sachem of the Tribe of Indians who claimed ownership of the land based upon their living there from the earliest times. This Sachem was one "Tobacus, Sachem for the Tribes of Setauket." and the land was bought by the New Englanders and was known as Setauket. Tobacus was paid with many feet of wampum, tools, spades, eel spears, lead for bullets and even a pair of child's socks.

Shortly thereafter, some fifty odd male emigrants came over from Boston and vicinity. Many of them were of high caliber, well educated and of independent spirit. The first settlement was located several miles from the Sound at what is now, the Village Green. Between the Green and the Sound lay a queer shaped body of water forming what is now Port Jefferson Harbor, then called by the name of Drowned Meadows, Setauket Harbor and what is now called Conscience Bay, then called Oldfield Bay.

Setauket was officially known as Brookhaven Town, today Brookhaven Township in the County of Suffolk. In this strip of land are such well known villages as Southampton 1640 on the Atlantic Ocean; Southold of about the same date. On the North Shore; Shelter Island, at the extreme North end. Riverhead was an outgrowth of Southold and was started in 1792.

In 1671 a Presbyterian Meeting House was built on the Eastside of the Village Green and in the back yard of it the body of William Jayne was buried in 1714. He had lived ninety six years, not a bad recommendation for the climate and environment of the little town of Setauket. In the year of his death the church was improved only to be badly damaged in 1777 when it was occupied by the British and used as a garrison where "large guns" were fixed to discharge from the upper windows. The burying ground was occupied and the monuments thrown down and most of the graves were leveled. Fortunately the original Jayne headstone was left undamaged.

But all the troubles of the little church were not due to war time conditions for in 1719, a William Jayne and others went on record with a determined objection as to the method of apportioning the seating in the church. The basis on which the seating was worked

out seems to have been quite complicated but seemingly the bone of contention was that those that paid the most, forty shillings, had the best seats, while the smaller contributors down to six shillings, were relegated to the side lines.

There was a great deal of trouble on Long Island during the Rebellion among the inhabitants then living there as they were divided into two camps, those who wanted to oust the British rule, and those who remained loyal. The descendants of William were quite evidently of the latter persuasion as witness the following.

I do hereby certify that Samuel Jayne of Brookhaven Township, age 18 years, has voluntarily sworn before me, bear Faith and True Allegiance to His Majesty, King George III; and that he will not, directly or indirectly, openly or secretly, aid, abet, counsel, shelter or conceal, any of His Majesty's enemies and those of his Government, or molest or betray the Friends of Government; but he will behave himself peaceably and quietly, as a Faithful Subject of his Majesty and his Government. Give under my hand on Long Island, this 1st of Sept., 1778.

Signed Wm. Ryson. GOVERNOR

However, certain Jaynes who had migrated to Pennsylvania were on the rebel's side. Capt. Timothy Jayne, who fought in the War of the Rebellion and who died and was buried in Middle Smithfield Cemetery, Penna.

It is recorded that in 1780 a party of Rebels visited Setauket and carried William Jayne Jr. to Conn. in order to trade him for Wm. Phillips, who had recently been taken at Smithtown at the Widow Blendenbergh's, on a trading party.

At the time that the Meeting House was occupied by the British, a raiding party under Col. Parsons and one hundred and fifty men attacked the church. They had come over from Black Rock, Conn. for this purpose, but the damage to either side was slight and the English, being sighted coming up the Sound in boats, they left hurriedly and returned to the mainland. Among them was Capt. Caleb Brewster, a native of Setauket, and a Zachariah Green, who, twenty years later was to become pastor of the identical church which he attacked that day. He lived to be ninety eight; and speaking of Brewsters, they all seem to be related to "Elder Brewster" of Conn. and it is recorded that a female of the line, Ruth Brewster, married Ebenezer Jayne, born Feb. 14, 1783. Ebenezer Jayne died Mar. 23, 1836. Ruth Brewster Jayne died Dec. 23, 1847.

Other names that stand out in the life of Setauket are the Woodhulls, the Scudders, the Strongs. Today a Strong still lives on Strong's Neck, the large tract of land which divides Conscience Bay from Setauket Harbor and Port Jefferson Harbor. In 1735 Abigail Strong was a witness to a deed of land from William Jayne, cooper, to Stephen Jayne, his son, a smith. In the little old church yard, these names and others appear again and again and every now and then, mixed in with these names are the names of female Jayne's

who intermarried with them.

They still are burying Jaynes in the Presbyterian graveyard, and this is because there are still quite a number of Jaynes living in the vicinity. In fact the local telephone book lists sixteen Jaynes living in Suffolk Co. as against ten living in N.Y., Kings, Queens, Richmond, Nassau and West Chester. In Setauket are the Alfred, Arthur and C.H. Jayne who keeps the General Store, and Mrs. M. Scudder Jayne. Others in Suffolk Co. are Carlston Jayne, Charles Jayne, Fay, Robert and Selah Jayne. Bay Shore; Henry R. Jayne. Stoney Brook; Walter J. Jayne, at Patchog; The other five are at Eastport, Greenport and East Quogue, L.I.

To the visitor to Setauket today it seems very much the same as it must have been two hundred years ago. It is quiet and reserved, stringing out over a large area, with gently winding, narrow roads and few inhabitants about. The only really new development is on Strong's Neck where the present Mr. Strong is building a number of small modern houses for summer or summer and winter occupancy. He has put in a number of roads and has cut back the heavy growth on the Bluff to the North, so that standing there, one looks over the narrow channel connecting Conscience Bay with Port Jefferson Harbor out over Setauket Beach to the seemingly limitless blue Sound. To the West is sand spit and pine, to the East the mouth of the harbor formed by the tip of Setauket Beach and Mt. Misery Point. And below are the gulls, the ducks and the herons, skimming, diving or wading as surely they must have done in those long ago days. And these water-lovers are seemingly just as alone and untouched as they must have been then.

"We hear from Setauket that last Friday night a party of rebels surrounded the house of Dr. Punderson, took him prisoner and carried him into Conn. On that same night the same party took Mr. William Jayne Junior. The rebels told Mrs. Punderson that they had taken the Doctor to exchange for John Smith and Mr. Jayne for William Phillips, who were taken at Smithtown at the widow Blydenbough's, on a trading party. T

The refugees were on the American side and not Tories. There were many claims against N.Y. State for expense of removal to Conn. after the Battle of Long Island. I found very little had been written about these unfortunate people. Their seven years exile

to Conn. rivals in pathos that of the French Acadians. The following names were found in the volume mentioned above:

There were Horton names as well as Norton; Nathan Woodhull, 1st Major of Brookhaven, Suffolk Co. Militia, 1st or West Regiment; Caleb Woodhull, 1st Lieu. Suffolk Co; 1st Lieu. Abraham Woodhull, Huntington Co; from Brookhaven came Ensign Benjamin Woodhull; Capt. Wm. Brewster; Nathaniel Brewster of Smithtown Co.; Robert Jayne and Shadrack Jayne, enlisted men; James Woodhull, 1st Lieu. John Woodhull, Nathan Woodhull; George Norton, Capt. Bostwick, Col. C. Webb, 19th Continental, crossed the Delaware at Trenton Dec. 25, 1776. Nathaniel Norton lost a gun in Arnold's detachment Quebec 1775.

There was on Long Island July 20, 1776 one hundred thousand horned cattle and a much larger number of sheep. Aug. 24th Gen. Nathaniel Woodhull was ordered to guard or remove the stock to safety and that if necessary it should be destroyed rather than fall into the hands of the British. Also that such stock should be purchased by General Woodhull for the army. At the Battle of Long Island Aug. 27th, Gen. Woodhull had the cattle driven well eastward. The next day Gen. Woodhull and others were ordered to destroy the stock. Thus, down to the Battle of Long Island, the chief effort was to preserve property. p. 30 Before evacuating N.Y.C. 1776 a 1 stores were carried to White Plains, N.Y.

The Loyalists were among the most prominent citizens. Mayor David Mathews of N.Y. City was one of these. Their treatment was very severe. Thomas Helme of Brookhaven reported many Loyalists. The state of N.Y. confiscated personal and real property of all unfriendly to the American cause.

An excerpt from "A History of the Jayne Family in America" compiled by Dr. Walter Addison Jayne 1914 of Denver, Colo.

"John P. Jayne, who it is said investigated family genealogy during a visit to England, published over his name a coat of arms said to be those of the de Jeanne family as obtained at the Chief Heraldry Office in London. They are described: arms, argent; a lion rampant, azure, between three escallops, gules. Crest, out of a ducal crown, or a demi-lion rampant, azure, holding between the paws, and escallop shell, gules. Motto: Ex Virtute Bonos.

This information was found in "General Armory of Eng and, Scotland, Ireland, Wales by Burke p.333 (Desk Bk. N.Y. Pub. Lib.) The description was: "Ar on a chevron, gu between three martlets, sa two swords in saltire ppr. pomme's and hilts or entwined by a double chain of the last."

Both TIMOTHY JAYNE and his wife, Rachel Evans Jayne are buried at Eatonville in the graveyard of the old brick Baptist Church on the road from Tunkhannock to Wilks Barre, Penna. The head stones had both fallen but were reset in cement in 1951. They are in good condition for their age and kind of stone. Here in this church in the early days Elder DAVID JAYNE, brother of Captain Timothy Jayne, preached some of the first sermons.

 Howard F.Brunges ( 865- 948) son of Rebecca Jayne Brunges and Jacob Brunges, said that he remembered Silas Aumick, who was his great uncle by marriage to his great Aunt Julia

Jayne Aumick. He was a large powerful man, heavy of features and rough in appearance, kindly, hardworking and honest. Howard remembering him planting the long rows of maple trees that now line the streets of Tunkhannock, Penna. He and his brothers planted them all the way from Eatonville to Tunkhannock, a living monument today as they meet limb to limb over the streets in a dense and beautiful shade the five miles to Eatonville. Tunkhannock has the most beautiful maple trees to be found in any village. It is said the Aumicks had Indian blood. The early settlers were woodsmen, trappers, hunters and loyal Americans ready to fight for the right, as they saw it, as witnessed by the many Aumick names in the Civil War. They lived in Sugar Hollow near Eatonville, Penna. and there are many by the name of Aumick buried in the Eatonville Baptist Cemetery. GREAT AUNT JULIA JAYNE AUMICK lived to be very old. Her home was poor but clean and scrubbed until it was as sweet and clean as the woods that surrounded it. The Brunges children were all born in Sugar Hollow on the level ground below the hill farm of Porter Jayne, so they knew Great Uncle Silas Aumick and Great Aunt Julia Jayne Aumick. I, Miss Lillian Jayne Dull, remember when at the age of five years with my mother's (Eva Jayne Dull) cousin, Sophronia Jayne, leading me by the hand, we walked along the steepest roads and the darkness of the deep woods made me, a child of the prairie, afraid of the wilderness, although I loved and still do love the woods and streams of Wyoming Co. of Eatonville with Bowman's Creek, and the banks of the Susquehanna River with its beautiful views of valley and mountain scenery as fair as any in our country.

Mr. Brunges was one of the oldest members of the First Methodist Church in Tunkhannock, a member of the Board of Trustees; a member of Temple Lodge, Free and Accepted Masons; of the Tunkhannock Grange and of the American Jersey Cattle Club. He was closely associated with the affairs of the local church and was a large contributor towards the building of the new church edifice, of which he was justly proud. He was always generous in any movement for the betterment of the community he thought worthy of his support.

Mr. Brunges married second to Miss Minnie Bannatyne on Nov. 5, 1930. Miss Bannatyne for many years had been an assistant in the Tunkhannock, Penna. Post Office. She was the daughter of Robert Bannatyne (born July 17, 1838) and his wife, Ruth Vosburg Banatyne (born Nov. 5, 1840) They married Nov. 5, 1865. He was a Captain in the Civil War and the son of Archibald Bannatyne (born in Scotland Jan. 30, 1809, died 1901, married Elizabeth Bunnell 1834, born Jan. 2, 1819, died 1854, the daughter of John Bunnell (born Aug. 13, 1790, died Aug. 11, 1872 and his wife, Mary Place Bunnell, born Sept. 7, 1793, died Nov. 3, 1851) John Bunnell was the son of Benjamin Bunnell I, born in Penna. 1752, married CATHERINE BERRY, born Nov. 26, 1759

Rachel's three sons were decidedly "Evans" in looks and Welsh characteristics. They were handsome men and filled with the fire, eloquence and religious convictions of the Welsh people. Rachel's brother, George Evans, was one of the most eloquent preachers of his day and is still remembered by tradition in the towns where he preached. He has been written up in the Methodist Church history records. See "Evans" Genealogy.

Mrs. Theodora Ross Leighton, niece of Rev. Geo. Evans, said that GEORGE JAYNE was as handsome a man as she ever knew. Tall, dark and of fiery personality. She said he was the handsomest of the three JAYNE sons. He was a strong debater on all political issues of the day as well as religious topics. These debates were held in the School

House in Sugar Hollow. He was County Commissioner of Wyo. Co. for a time.

None of his six children bear the coloring and general characteristics of the Evans family, being blond, blue eyed or medium blond. Those I have known, Charlie, Nellie and Georgia were all fair complexioned. (L.J.D.)

Of the three daughters of RACHEL EVANS JAYNE, Polly and Rebecca were dark Rebecca had large dark eyes. Betsy, died young, but there are dark eyed grand children.

After several battles with the Indians who dotted the trail, he landed in Sacramento, Calif, and was among the lucky to discover gold.

Unwilling to risk encounter with the Indians by returning overland, he returned by boat via Cape Horn. As soon as he arrived in New York, he sent some gold to the Arnold Adams Company in London for a double dial watch which his son, WADE HAMPTON JAYNE now possesses. The watch was designed to tell time in two countries simultaneously. It is inscribed with a sketch of the "Golden Gate"

DAVID A. JAYNE desired such a watch because he was sent to South America during the Civil War to purchase horses for the Government. An exact duplicate of the watch is on display in the Smithsonian Institute in Washington D.C.

SAMUEL CARVER JAYNE was a banker in Berwick, Penna. He was always much interested in the Jayne Reunions and as long as they were held, up to World War I, he attended and was the historian.  
"This article appeared in the Wilkes Barre Times Leader March 21, 1928.  
SAMUEL C. JAYNE died at Berwick, Penna. He served as cashier of the First National Bank more than sixty years. He was ill only three weeks."  
SAMUEL CARVER JAYNE, one of the oldest, and up to a short time ago, one of the most active bank officials in this section of the state, died yesterday morning at two o'clock at his home on West Front Street, Berwick.  
He was age 89 years. From 1869 he had been cashier of the First National Bank of Berwick. Three weeks ago he contracted a severe cold which developed into a slight attack of pneumonia. From this illness he recovered but his advanced years superinduced a weakness resulting in his death.  
Mr. Jayne was born in Wyoming Co., Penna. and at an early age entered Wyoming Seminary at Kingston, Penna. After concluding his studies there, he entered the University of Michigan.  
. This was during the Civil War and having located at Janesville, Wisconsin, he enlisted in the 40th Wisconsin Volunteers. He served for a time and then was discharged because of illness and returned to Berwick.  
In 1867 he was named principal of the Berwick Schools. He held this position one year and in 1868 became officiated with the First National Bank. When the cashiership became vacant in 1869 Mr. Jayne was appointed to fill the vacancy. At that time the bank had deposits of \$18,000. At his death the deposits of the institution totaled \$2,150,000 and resources were \$2,560,000  
Six weeks ago officials of the First National Bank and many other bankers from all over the state gathered at Berwick and tendered a testimonial dinner to Mr. Jayne as he entered the sixty-first year of his cashiership of the bank. During the dinner a handsome loving cup was presented to Mr. Jayne by his colleagues.  
Mr. Jayne was the last of his family. His wife and two children preceded him in death.  
One son, J. GEER JAYNE, who died eleven years ago, was for many years associated with a Berwick bank, and was widely known throughout the Wyoming Valley.

Until the start of his illness, Mr. Jayne was at his desk at the bank daily, and held an active control in the institution's affairs.

The funeral will be held from the late home on Friday at two o'clock with the Rev. D.D. Kauffman, pastor of the First Methodist Church, officiating. Interment will be in Pine Grove Cemetery.
